Philosophy of Madrassatur - Raudah

From its inception, PMA philosophy has been based on the belief that the Muslim child must grow and develop into a well-rounded, socially successful, spiritual, human being and should be inspired to freely explore the harmony between creation and the Creator with the guidance of dedicated Muslim educators and administrators. It is this balance of intellect and spirit that the PMA curriculum seeks to achieve, to educate our kids in religious instruction.

The PMA Exco, along with the Sheigh, Administrator, and Principal, defines the broad margins of the curriculum as the whole set of experiences that encompass all that the learners are engaged in throughout their madrassa lives.

The PMA Exco made its top priority to seek and hire qualified educators who demonstrate a commitment to the values and practice of Islam. It is a fruitless endeavor to educate children according to standards and values that are not adhered to by the role models in their lives, both at home and at madrassa.

PMA meets the crucial challenge of stimulating the minds of Muslim boys and girls, safeguarding their innocence at a time where many societies had lost their moral compass, preserving the Islamic cultural heritage and practices of their fore bearers while preparing them for meaningful roles in our society. PMA Exco and administrators, feel strongly that it is the duty of parents to give their children the opportunity for growth in a safe and secure environment, as a means of spiritual and moral

enlightenment according to the Qur'an and the model of the Prophet (May Allah peace be upon him). It is this experience that will prepare these children to lead wholesome, productive lives in the world at large.

Key Madrassa Learning Goals

- **Qurān reading**
 - Learners should be able to recite the Holy Quran with all Tajweed rules
 - As far as possible from memory.
- **Fiqh** - Learners will learn Islamic essentials such wudu, salah, zakah, fasting, hadj, cleanliness etc.
- **Tawhid** - Learners will learn how to know Allah Almighty
- **Moral Training** - Learners will learn Islamic ethics and behaviour

- **History** – deals with lessons learnt with regards to the lives of the Sahaba (RAH)
- **Arabic** – Learners will learn basic Arabic language and writing

Admission is dependent on, amongst others, the availability of a place in the particular Form/Grade for which the application is being made.

Applications will open on the 1 November each year. – any applications submitted after the closing date of 31 January will go on a waiting list to be considered after all other applications have been processed.

January 31 is the general application deadline.

However, due to high applicant interest in certain grades, we recommend submitting your application prior to year end closure.

Tuition Fees 2024

Thank you for your unwavering support during the year 2023.

Essentially, the tuition fees for 2024 will be adjusted accordingly to the table below. The adjustment is effective 1 January 2024.

Please note that fees are charged monthly effective 1 January, are set out in the table below;

Please note that all Madrassa Fees to be settled by end November 2023.

In addition,

- a pre-deposit upfront **R150 learner registration levy** per learner will be charged covering costs of stationery, photocopying, worksheets, reports and files. Please note this does **not include textbooks** and excludes lost content which will be charged separately.
- A refundable deposit of R 250 is payable on registration to cover the textbooks.
- As well as one month's tuition fees in advance.
- a Standard burqa and Madrasa bag are available at the Madrasa to purchase at **R 35 and R 150** respectively

Fees are calculated in advance with statements issued within 2 weeks of the new month. Please ensure that fees are paid so that we can maintain a positive cash flow and thereby meet all our financial obligations. The Madrasa requests that parents please notify accordingly should learners be withdrawn during the course of the year. Parents will not be liable for cancellation fees after the date of withdrawal.

We appeal to parents, to prioritise payment of madrasa fees. Without the payment of fees, we cannot pay our teachers for their hard work and commitment to our children.

Should you have difficulty in making these payments on time, please inform the Principal of the situation, otherwise you will be held liable to settle outstanding amounts on demand. No learner will be disadvantaged due to a lack of financial resources provided the Principal is consulted and informed of the situation. All such matters will be dealt with in CONFIDENCE.

Our preference is that parents make payments via **EFT**, using the Account Name reflected on the statement received. Please insist on a receipt for all cash payments made.

Curriculum

- **Islamic Studies**

The Islamic Studies has different components like Tawhid (unity of faith), Akhlaq (moral education), Fiqh (Islamic jurisprudence), and Islamic history. It is primarily based on the 'Learning Islam' syllabus, categorized into different levels known as *Forms*. The 'Madrassah al Quds' syllabus stops at Form 7 (at around age 14).

Form 8 to 10 covers the Study Islam Comprehensive Fiqh Guide and Study Islam Volume One.

The Young Adult (11-12) classes covers the syllabus of Study Islam Volume 2.

Young Adult level: Grades 9, 10, 11 & 12

comprising of the following subjects:

- *Fiqh*
- *Tawhid*
- *Quran and Tafseer*
- *Hadeeth*
- *Seerah*

- **Qur'anic Recitation**

Learners who are in the foundation phase will start with **My Arabic Alphabet Workbook**. This workbook introduces the letters of the Arabic alphabet via the phonetic method. It has different activities such as colouring-in, completing patterns, tracing and writing exercises designed to enhance the learning experience. Learners struggling with their fine-motor skills will greatly benefit from this workbook.

This workbook has 3 learning outcomes. The learner will be able to;

1. Demonstrate a good understanding of the Arabic Alphabet
2. Recognise and sound single printed-form letters of the Arabic Alphabet, and
3. Write single printed-form letters of the Arabic Alphabet.

Other learners will start with **Quran Reader 1** which introduces the single as well as cursive shapes of the Arabic alphabet before moving on to the three short vowels.

Once learners have mastered this reader, they move on to **Quran Reader 2** which focuses on the sukun, long vowels, madds and the tanwin. **Quran Reader 3** deals with the mushaddad.

At the Madrassa we recognise each child is unique having individual pace and progress levels. Our aim is by the end of the Quran Reader 3 learners *should* be in a position to recite the Quran by applying all the tajweed rules. **Quran Reader 4** facilitates the transition into the Quran.

Assessments

- The madrassa uses continuous assessment, which means that all class tests, projects, homework and practicals are taken into account

- Foundation phase: No formal exam
- Intermediate & Senior groups: Formal exam in October
- Two reports cards per year: June & December

Parental involvement

Opportunities are created for parents to meet with teachers to discuss the progress of their children. Please make use of these scheduled meetings. Parents wishing to discuss any matter outside of these times should do so either before Madrassa starts in the morning or after Madrassa closes in the afternoon. **Please do not meet with teachers during their class teaching time.**

A tremendous responsibility rests with parents to ensure that learners do the necessary assigned work during the week, especially since the Madrassa is held only once a week. Learners who do not work consistently during the week progress very slowly and should spend at least 15–20 minutes daily with their homework.

Chat groups are set up for each class to ease the communication with regard to homework, class activities and memorisation etc.

Parents are also required to sign off on the Qur'an Reader assessments as and when it's completed.

We urge parents to disclose any health problems (e.g Asthma) as well as any learning difficulties the child may have to the Principal or Educator. Additionally, parents need to keep the Educators informed of children who are going to be absent or withdrawn.

Contact details of your learner's Educator as well as specific stationery requirements will be supplied with your **Welcome pack** for your class.

Madrassa Code of Conduct

- Learners must be punctual and come prepared for classes.
- Learners must be decently and modestly attired.
 - Boys to be dressed with thobe and fez.
 - Girls with thobe and burqa or scarf.
 - a Standard burqa and Madrassa bag are available at the Madrassa to purchase at R 35 and R 150 respectively.
- Learners are not allowed to leave the Masjid premises without prior arrangement.
- Learners have to perform Thuhr on Saturday and Asr in the week, - this is part of the madrassa programme. We appeal to parents to support us in this, and to join their children in salah.
- Parents must please notify the Educator if the child needs to leave early.
- No learner is to have any sharp objects, or anything that might be used as a weapon, at the Madrassa.
- Parents are not to disturb learners during Madrassa hours. Messages must be relayed via the admin staff.
- Cellphones and games must be left at home. Should learners need to carry cellphones for emergencies, it must be switched off during class times.
- All valuables must be left at home. The Madrassa cannot be held liable for any loss or damage.
- All disciplinary matters will be dealt with by the Principal.

- Learners must be fetched from madrassa punctually. This is a serious safety concern.
- Unruly behaviour will not be tolerated on the premises.
- Menstruation - Please be advised that it is the Madrassa's policy that girls having their Hayd (menstruation) are permitted to read the Qur'an for educational purposes. We therefore encourage girls to be present and partake in the Qur'an reading classes, but respect Parents decision should no recital be requested. Please communicate with the Educator should this be requested.

Library

One of the main functions of the madrassa is to disseminate the teachings of Islam, and the madrassa has always been mindful of the fact that a properly equipped Lending Library would facilitate the attainment of this noble objective. After much demanding work from the resolute community and immense generosity, we finally started issuing books to our madrassa learners as from 16 July 2022 and thereafter every Tuesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays, We look forward to having parents borrowing books too, InshaAllah. Alghamdulillah, finally the library is open for lending, and we are grateful to our teachers, learners, and parents for their patience and support.
